		must be submitted as soon as possible.

		prioritize repeatability courses as well as those courses that ar
		severely overdue.
		Overdue courses must be reviewed by EDC and are being
		prescreened in order to make this process flow smoothly.
		Courses that are approved for repeatability by the Academic
		Senate and Chancellor's Office (CO) may be included in the
		printed catalog or will be included in the catalog addendum.
		Departments are asking if such courses can be scheduled for F
		2013.
		C&I recommended that department chairs be notified about
		courses that are overdue.
		Every year the lists of courses that are due and those that are
		overdue courses are made available to Division Deans during instruction meeting.
		It will be more practical to make the list available if Academic
		Senate provides it to faculty.
		Schate provides it to faculty.
		C-ID submission:
		Courses must be submitted for C-ID approval in order to keep
		them in the AA-T and AS-T degrees.
		If courses are denied or conditionally approved, faculty have o
		year to change/amend a course. We will need to decide how
		monitor these changes in WebCMS. Revisions must be made as soon as possible for those changes
		to be reported to senate.
		No problems are anticipated. Potentially there might be some
		problems with some course with unit value issues, (when a
		course has fewer units than the C-ID descriptor) but we do no
		have many of those courses.
		This C-ID topic will be placed on a future C&I agenda.
		Maybe it would be better to request a resolution to make thes
		courses a priority and prevent being out of compliance.
		Senate will make a resolution to make C-ID courses a
		priority for review.
		As far as the work of EDC goes, Terri asked the Senate to
		reconsider the need to review courses that were submitted pri
		to April 2011 that have already been prescreened.
		Guidelines on Repeatability from the Chancellor's Office
Į.		are not out yet.
		Title 5 language implies that Work Experience (WE) courses as
		not repeatable but we still don't have a definitive answer with

		respect to WE. We have made a conscious decision of not removing repeatability from such courses because we have received conflicting emails from the CO. The Academic Senate suggests leaving them as they are. George is worried that if courses end up not being repeatable the College might have to suffer economic consequences when claiming these courses for apportionment. Courses should not be problematic because they are entered individually and is easier to track students who have taken these courses. An example is AGHE 83A which is required to be taken 4 times.
