		Division Deans use faculty recommendations and collaborative discussion to evaluate enrollment options.					
		George Bradshaw is also involved in enrollment issues and should be included in enrollment discussions.					
		Prerequisites also influence which courses should be offered.					
		Faculty have asked for a restoration of enrollment management. This will be a topic at the Education Planning Summit.					
		Also need a group dedicated to oversee course offering to ensure that the right courses are offered so students can complete the programs they are pursuing.					
		Prerequisites can create a choke point in a program. There are concerns about choke points in general. We have cut many courses due to the budget cuts and no matter which courses we look at there will be choke points. We just don't have enough courses for students unless we offer courses for specific degrees.					
		Need to address the possibility that students may be unable to obtain degrees because courses aren't being offered. Recommendation: Create an Academic Senate task force to explore State Resolution 13.04 F11 Course Development and Enrollment.
