Historically, the lack of rationale on new courses did not prevent approval of new courses.  EDC is asking for a better rationale for all new courses.  Terri and Michelle have been giving faculty guidelines on how to provide a reasonable rationale. For example, if the course is going to be stand-alone, we need the rationale to justify the course.  Shouldn't something having to do with feasibility exist at stage 3? The coversheet has new language regarding this issue.  Courses need the support of administration through PIE. If faculty answer the questions from EDC, the course can be moved through the process.  C&I recommended sending the course back to stage 1, ensure that the questions are answered, process course accordingly, and simultaneously submit a modification to the AA-T.
