3. Committee Purpose, Planning, and Membership	 3.1 J. Ocampo announced that reading faculty and SSSPAC were recognized with an Academic Senate "10+1" Award for "Standards and Policies for Student Preparation and Success" for their work reviewing reading competency requirements and making changes through the shared governance process. 3.2 E. Hill-Enriquez reported that there are no other AmLa faculty members able to represent AmLa on SSSPAC next year beside herself. 3.3 SSSPAC asked for an additional at-large member for 2014-2017 and has not received a response. A suggestion was made to send this request through SP&S again. 3.4.a Currently, there are four components of SSSP: assessment, orientation, counseling & advising, and 	3.2 E. 	 3.4.c J. Ocampo recommended the ongoing addition of the SSSP Project Program Coordinator on SSSPAC. Formerly, this was an at-large position, but if the ongoing position is approved, this will increase SSSPAC membership from twelve to thirteen. 3.4.d Michael Harper from English will replace M. Dougherty on SSSPAC from 2015-2018. 3.4.e E. Hill-Enriquez has received approval from Academic Senate to represent AmLa on SSSPAC 	3.4.c J. Ocampo will check with Classified Senate to see if approval of ongoing SSSP Project Program Coordinator is needed 3.4.e J. Ocampo will contact Dan Smith to clarify E. Hill-Enriquez's roles as SSSPAC co-chair, AWE facilitator rep., and AmLa rep.
4. Registration Holds for Assessment and Orientation	4. 1 T. Mauch reported that orientation holds are anticipated to start back up on July 1st for fall. Assessment and orientation holds have been lifted since July 23, 2014.	
5. Common Assessment	5.1 D. Beydler attended a webinar where Link-Systems demonstrated test question templates. Fifty templates will be created and pilot schools will begin testing in summer and will continue into fall. In Spring 2016, Link-Systems will apply for approval from the Chancellor's Office and pilot the actual tests. With Chancellor's Office approval, there will be more role outs in Fall 2016 and Spring 2017. Each campus will have much work to do using competency maps to place students into actual classes.	
6. Comprehensive Educational Plan (Notification to Students)	6.1 L. DeLeon reported that email notifications have been sent to students who are close to fifteen units and who do not yet have Comprehensive Ed Plans. Students need to complete Comprehensive Ed Plans prior to their third semesters or fifteen units. One hundred and eighty notices were sent out in fall for students who started in 2014. L. DeLeon is working	

	on a "Fact Form" (What is SSSP? What does it mean to matriculate? What can faculty do to help students?) to help instructors become familiar with SSSP regulations. There is currently a page in the Student Handbook on SSSP guidelines. A suggestion was made to send a PDF to faculty members for inclusion in their syllabi.	
7. Test Approval Proposals	7.1 J. Ocampo forwarded an email to SSSPAC members from Chancellor Office consultants granting preliminary approval for math and chemistry placement tests. Full approval was recommended by the consultants which will be forwarded to Chancellor's Office workgroup.	
8. Updates	 8.1 AWE: A system has been devised for collecting names and IDs of students who choose to write to the third prompt. This information is being collected for research purposes. 8.2 Learning Assistance: An inquiry was made as to whether Assessment staff or reading faculty will be evaluating multiple measures for students taking DRP 8.3 Counseling: New online orientation was implemented this week, but updates are still needed. Hiring of a Title V Counselor and a general counseling position are in process and will be submitted to the board in June. - 8.7 Math: 151 students completed surveys from Spring 2015 Information Sessions and 95% of answers were "Agree/Strongly Agree" when asked if they would recommend the workshop, if they felt they knew how to prepare for the placement test, if they felt satisfied with the workshop, and if they knew which placement test to take. Summer sessions will be given by Eric Kaljumagi. In fall, sessions will be funded through SSSP and not Basic Skills. J. Ocampo shared a CSU/UC Mathematics Diagnostic Testing Project California Community Colleges Newsletter from Spring 2015 with information on "Common Assessment Initiative" and "MDTP Test Distribution 2013-14."
