MINUTES (Nov 15, 2011)

- Discuss example of PIE – Jemma
 - Jemma provided an example of how her division records their SLO work, including having faculty provide a report to the division on the positive results of their efforts.
 - There is a need and desire to capture higher-level work and success at the division and institutional level.
 - Barbara commented that departments will have a “paper option” this year.
- Review “Update” – Jason
 - Jason discussed the update as well as shared examples of how other college’s prompt their faculty through the SLO process. How would/could this work on our campus? Could Jason and Dan use this type of document to reach out to departments?
 - We discussed the need to maintain the course-level efforts, but we must also focus on program-level outcomes in the spring as well as GEOs.
 - Regarding GEOs, we need to reinvigorate this process, as well as help the college continue meaningful work in this area. There was also conversation on “competencies” vs. GEOs.
 - We discussed having greater representation from the college on our committee so that all areas are represented in our discussions. Eric K. suggested we notate this information on our annual planning document to the Senate so that the President can try to increase representation through membership.

 - Barbara shared ACCJC’s “Annual Report on College Progress and Challenges.”
 - Barbara also shared a draft of objectives for the year based upon our goal setting. We will continue to review this document and add comments as necessary.
