Discussion	The Council came to a consensus to move forward to the Senate Executive Board for approval.



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		<p>over students' abilities to change their own goals/majors versus maintaining oversight for purposes like SAP for financial aid. Many students are "hanging on" because they are not yet accepted to transfer. Of concern are students who keep taking classes as well as students who are on long wait lists for allied health programs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cohort model for non-nursing. Eric asked cohort model are for non-nursing programs. Council members were unsure. • Cross-reference with another column to link to objectives from another goal. • Enrollment Management (Student's Own Goals): LeAnn brought up the fact that labor market needs are tied to CTE programs but student interest doesn't necessarily guide curriculum and enrollment management. How will courses be prioritized for development for transfer, rather than just for student interest? LeAnn explained that there must be rationale for new courses. Problems arise when the response is "student demand" and it can not be documented. <p><i>Review how new courses/instructional programs are developed and aligned with current labor market needs, and students' <u>career interests and transfer pattern requirements.</u></i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Communications of Repeat Policy: change to "Develop scripted guidelines that faculty can use in classes to inform students of the policy." • Move "Develop a model to predict success" to Recommended Actions and combine with "BSCC would like to pilot this for Fall 2012." • Connect 4: concern by the Senate that if this program grows extensively, these students will take seats away from students' with the highest priorities. 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		<p>students do not test into the higher level courses that higher unit students will need. Tom stated that he does not believe that the program will ever grow to 5,000. Additionally, divisions monitor the enrollment limits.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Counseling 1 has been approved to be offered over a 2-week basis. Tom explained that further development of Counseling 1 and the STEP to College program. • Basic Skills Placement/Student Testimonials: this was assigned to Counseling and Learning Assistance. • GPS Roadmap – “Consider requiring students success classes for <i>first time freshmen</i> (FTF), especially basic skills students. Add a bullet: “research how many courses we would need and how we would go about offering them.” • EARLY Early Intervention clarification – “begin interventions upon application to the college.” <p>The Council had a discussion on what happens next: If approved by the Senate Executive Board and adopted by the full Senate, Eric will then work with the Administration to communicate these pieces to the various entities named under “governance direction.”</p>

LeAnn mentioned that there is no infrastructure to collect, manage or store personal items that would be kept in the library collection. "The materials will be kept in the Library collection so the materials may be available to all College personnel." These are items that are "integral to a College program, event or curriculum." Within available resources, the video will be captioned by the college; the college would retain the captioned copy, for use by others. LeAnn asked about a collection development policy – not everything that college employees/faculty think are worthy are placed into their collection. LeAnn explained that an infrastructure does not exist to handle these. Consideration: that the captioned copy does not necessarily need to be retained by the library, but could be retained/catalogued/accessed at the department level.</p> <p>Training will be made available to use Camtasia software to caption one's own videos.</p> <p>Regarding access to captioned materials in the classroom – disabled individuals have the right to maintain confidentiality in the classroom. Thus deaf and individuals who are hard of hearing can not be required to openly disclose their disability. In order to protect students' rights to anonymity and confidentiality, faculty are encouraged to put a statement in the syllabus that shares videos may be shared in the class, and if captioning is needed/desired, the student may ask that captioning be turned on. Richard said that (speaking from his personal point of view) that he believes that captioning should have to be turned on for all. Grace mentioned that some believe that viewing the captioning is distracting. LeAnn explained that there is a difference between closed captioning and subtitles in that closed captioning indicates other audio cues such as door bell sounds, doors closing, etc.</p>	<p>Clarification of wording suggested for AP 5142 – to clarify what students' rights are in terms of having captioning turned on and how students can go about requesting this particular accommodation.</p> <p>Grace will consider combining AP 5141 and AP 5142.</p>



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		<p>Kristina shared that if the sound were turned off for all, it could be done – Grace confirmed that it is equal access. Eric says that individuals miss secondary cues when captioning is on. LeAnn mentioned that captioning is also of assistance to non-native English speakers.</p> <p>Micol asked about the role of Human Resources. Grace explained that HR is the place for appeals.</p> <p>AP 5140: Changes were made to the verifications section to clarify that students can go to HR instead of DSPS. However, “professors are not permitted to offer accommodations without authorization from DSPS or the ADA 504 Compliance Officer.</p> <p>Eric mentioned that the proposed APs do not show the actual changes from the original APs. Grace explained that AP 5141 and AP 5142 were pulled out (conceptually) from AP 5140.</p> <p>Eric asked for the differentiation of AP 5142 and AP 3450. The difference is that AP 5142 is more focused on students and AP 3450 is more focused on faculty. The specific concern is that “Department and Divisions must” is included under AP 5142 but is also included under AP 3450. Eric also suggested combining AP 5141 and AP 5142.</p>
