a.	AP 5055 – Enrollment Priorities – Audrey/George/Tom/Daniel	•	Eric had prepared another version with a clean-up of typos, added "degree applicable" in front of units on the 3 rd page (100 degree applicable units), appeals process needs to be developed (to be developed by Counseling) Focus right now is on the messaging to students and decide whether to begin with a 'soft' implementation for Summer 2014 in advance of Fall 2014. The concern is that this implementation in Banner is a complete overhaul and we want to be sure it will run appropriately. The consensus is to prepare one, generic message for all students. Students who have completed 100 or more degree applicable units will receive a later registration priority date. The Council is recommending not including units from other colleges. Discussion focused on whether to have a separate message for students on probation. The regulations do appear to specify a separate notice to students on probation. Angel led a discussion on counseling interventions with students on probation. (Students do not have an "academic standing" until they have completed 12 units). Angel shared documents from counseling. Counseling is proposing that if students complete interventions, their original priority registration date can be restored. Section (n) allows for an appeal due to significant academic improvement (e.g., if the student's term GPA has improved but	 Consensus to develop 2 separate messages. Generic message for all students regarding the 100-unit limit. Message to students on academic and/or progress probation not decided. Counseling asked to work on language to AP 5055 as well as a message to students based on their probation status. A winter work session on AP 5055 will be held for all SP&S Council members who are able to make it.



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		 the cumulative GPA has not yet cleared 2.00). At the present time, the student who falls onto probation after the first semester has their registration date changed to the "last day of registration" held until they complete the online intervention. Students who are on probation for 2 consecutive semesters, are told to participate in a non-mandatory workshop. Regardless, they do NOT lose their registration priority. At the present time, we are more lenient for students on the 2nd term of probation. Counseling's intent is to implement an intervention for the students on 2nd term of probation. The question is whether students would lose priority registration. Should an "automatic appeals process" be created for students making improvement, but have not yet cleared their cumulative probationary status? There are 2 pathways to consider: Develop an automatic appeals system for students showing progress Allow waivers for students on 2 consecutive semesters of probation who have participated in a counseling intervention.

C.	Counseling Intervention Plan – Alina & Angel	Silver Calzada attended to make this presentation along with Alina. This is a follow-up from an Academic Senate resolution (2009-04) from 2010 regarding interventions for students from the new repeat policy. A Math 51 Counseling Intervention Pilot was conducted during Spring 2012. Three math professors and counselors participated. Counselors made presentations in Math 51 classes. There were no observable differences in pass rates or success in three Math 51 classes. The findings were that the majority of students did not access the resource provided – which was a "pass" to see a counselor without an appointment. They found that in one class, 7 of the 11 students receiving "F" grades had previously repeated the class. 59% passed with A, B, or C grades and 16% of students in this class received D and F grades. There was a confounding variable in one class that had a disproportionately high enrollment of DSPS students and student athletes. In class II, 37% of students received D and F grades with 5 of 13 students having taken Math 51 previously.	The Counseling Department will research additional interventions for students who have recorded one or more repeats ("W", "D" or "F") including portal notices, pre- assessments, registration holds and will return to a future SP&S meeting to present their recommendations.
		Students needed to complete intake forms to enable the counselor to follow-up with the instructor. We do not have a lot of other data about the students who did not pass.	



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		 Micol asked about the motivation/benefits that counselors presented to students. Alina explained they would share strategies to assist in successfully completing math. Juan Carlos suggesting the importance of connecting the student's enrollment in the class with the student following through with counseling. Angel was the original author of this resolution and this pilot was an attempt to address the concerns expressed in the resolution. Eric shared that we seem to know what to do to help students to be successful (like Bridge). However, how do we address thousands of students who are repeating courses? Glenda shared a Basic Skills proposal called "Pathways to Transfer" to guarantee students' enrollment in the next, successive course that will be linked to an LCOM class, LERN or COUN class. Either a tutor in the classroom or an SI will follow the students in the pathway. They will begin with 3 cohorts of English and 3 of math for the winter of 2014. Angel asked the faculty about their reaction to requiring students to have a signature prior to withdrawing from class. A concern that 	
		the drop date is so late in the term that it is too late for an intervention at that time.	



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		Glenda shared that some colleges are requiring students to attend an intervention after 2 repeats of a class. Consider some kind of communication after the first "W" or "D" or "F".
