1.	Approval of Minutes from September 8, 2011	The minutes from September 8, 2011 were approved.			
2.	Roadmap Action Plan	The college has received the allocated \$10,000 to participate in Roadmap Project. There are 12 community colleges across the United States that are participating in Roadmap. Mt. SAC is the only college in California that is participating in the group.			
		The goal of Roadmap is to create a map that will chart students on their academic paths. There will be a link to some of the colleges' current effective practices such as the Bridge program, ASPIRE, and tutoring. The roadmap will track the students and congratulate them when they reach predetermined milestones.			
		The team from Mt. SAC envisions an incredible, visual Roadmap that is displayed throughout the college. Terri would like to devote a portion of BSCC meetings to work on the Roadmap visual.			
		The committee would like to see the roadmap tied into the student portal so students may track themselves. The Roadmap project should be completed by the Summer of 2012.			
		A team from AAC&U will be visiting Mt. SAC on October 13, 2011. They will be meeting with Dr. Scroggins, Terri and Anabel. Terri invited the BSCC members to join them. Terri would also like to take them to visit some programs centers to give the team a perspective of Mt. SAC and its students.

3.	Basic Skills Orientation update - Newsletter	The orientations for Project Managers on September 8 and 9 went very well. Over 25 managers and key staff attended the orientations.

7.	Other -	It was announced that the Dev Ed Study Team will bring Duncan Andrade (speaker at last year's Student Success Conference) to their annual Parachutes and Ladders workshop. The fee for the speaker is \$10,000 plus expenses. The Dev Ed Study Team has asked Basic Skills for \$2,500, which is in addition to the \$5,000 that has already been funded to their project for 2011-2012. The committee fully supports the request. Terri will bring this item to the Vice President for her approval.
