### Getting Started at Mt. SAC to become a Student



**STEP 1: Application.** To add or register for classes, an application must be on file for the term you plan to start: Fall/Spring-16 weeks and Summer/Winter-6 weeks.

### **How to Apply**

If you're ready to join Mt. San Antonio College, it all starts with your application.





**STEP 2:** New Student Orientation (online). To support your journey at Mt. SAC, the Counseling department developed a comprehensive online Orientation that you may have completed before today's workshop.







### STEP 3: Assessment Questionnaire (AQ)

To ensure students take the right English, math, and reading courses, complete the online Assessment Questionnaire (AQ) for course placement. Most students will immediately receive placement results based on their answers on the AQ. The questions on the AQ ask about High School GPA, English and math courses, and grades in those courses. Students who have completed English or math college-level courses at another institution, submit an official transcript to Admissions & Records

### Certificates

- Certificates of Achievement and Skills Certificates available
- Focuses on career and technical skills
- Courses are primarily in the area of study (e.g. Child Development, Welding, Accounting, Supply Chain, etc.
- At least 1/2 of the credits earned towards the certificate must be completed at Mt. SAC
- Also available, <u>Certificates of</u>
   <u>Competency and Occupational</u>
   <u>Training Certificates of Completion</u>
   for certain non-credit programs of study.

Major Courses Only



- <u>Associate of Science (AS)</u> focuses on career & technical skills
- Associate of Arts (AA) is designed to meet the needs of students interested in graduating with a two-year college degree by studying in a specific area of emphasis.
- Associate of Science-Transfer (AS-T) & Associate of Arts-Transfer (AA-T), supports transfer to a CSU by completing half of the Bachelor's degree at Mt. SAC.





## Mt. San Antonio College Course Options

**ENGL** 

Provides a wide range of courses in English composition, literature, creative writing, including courses in developmental composition, college-level transferable composition and literature courses

Courses: ENGL 1A, ENGL 80, ENGL 1AH, ENGL 1AM, & ENGL 1C

AMLA

Provides non-native English-speaking students with the language skills they need to succeed in academic and professional endeavors. Courses: AMLA 1A, AMLA 90, AMLA 80, AMLA 70

ESL

Provides six levels that focus on listening, speaking, reading, writing, grammar, and pronunciation Courses: Level 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6 and VESL
