A sub-committee was formed, Deb Distante, Paul Kittle, and Jill Wilkerson, to discuss possible solutions and report back to the DLC.
Blackboard Update	DLC members, Barry Andrews, Dwight Ayle, Terri Beam, Deb Distante, Mary Johnson, Paul Kittle, Carol Webster, and Jill Wilkerson attended <i>"Blackboard System Essentials Training."</i> Training addressed the Blackboard Community and Content systems as well as systems administrator training. Workshops for <i>Blackboard Basics</i> are filling quickly. Currently, 166 faculty members have Blackboard accounts, and over 10,000 students are taking Blackboard- supported classes.	Next steps – OLSC staff are considering some approaches for how to expand the use of the Blackboard Enterprise System by additional faculty. Those faculty members who attended the <i>"Essentials Training"</i> will meet for discussion on October 24.
