**M**t. San Antonio College has had a long and rich athletic history since the opening of the college in 1946. Through the years, the Mt. SAC Athletic Program has been regarded as one of the premier athletic programs in the nation. Mt. SAC Teams have captured 47 California Community College Athletic Association (CCCCAA) State Championships.

The Mt. SAC Athletic Department has finished each year in the top 6 of the prestigious National Association of Two-Year College Athletic Administrators (NATYCAA) Cup since its inception in 2004. The award recognizes athletic excellence at the two-year college level. During the 2008-2009 academic year, the Mounties captured the prestigious award as the top athletic two-year institution in the state and arguably the nation.

Since 1967, Mt. SAC has been a part of the most competitive overall conference in the nation, the South Coast Conference (SCC). During the past decade, the Mt. SAC Athletic Program has captured the SCC Athletic Supremacy Award, recognizing the top athletic program in the conference, a remarkable 7 times, making Mt. SAC the top athletic program in the conference for the past decade.
