- 13,992 students completed an orientation in-person and online
- 23,386 students were provided counseling, advising, and educational planning services
 - 69.1% were new, first time students who enrolled in a credit course for either fall 2014, winter 2015, spring 2015, or summer 2015
- Ed Plans: Counselors assisted <u>15,591</u> students in developing at least an abbreviated education plan and <u>4,019</u> students in completing a comprehensive education plan.

 - 2015 STEP 120 abbreviated

Follow Up: July 1, 2014 - June 30, 2015

- 4.179 probation students were served via appointments, inperson and completed online workshops
- 2,086 undecided students were provided follow up services
- 6,027 basic skill students were provided follow up services
- Early Alert: 1,869 referrals were made to either counseling or tutoring services
