Roger Willis will be sending out a call to add another DLC Committee member.</p> <p>Last year's goals are in OneDrive. At our next meeting, we will set our goals for the year and update the membership list.</p>
Academic Senate	<p>Status of our hard work last year:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. RSI Rubric and Process Recommendation was reviewed and approved by Senate Exec in the spring and was presented as a discussion item at the last full Academic Senate meeting on June 2. It is on the agenda as an action item on the first Academic Senate meeting of this fall. 2. AP 4105 was approved with edits by C&I. Most of the discussion involved the wording about dropping students after they had missed 20% of the course. It was not found to have a basis in regulations. Academic Senate Exec recommends removing the sentence. It has not come to full Senate yet but will shortly.

SPOT and SPEQ Update – Summer Activity	<p>See attached graphic created by Michelle. We now have 825 SPOT-certified faculty! Congratulations to Luis who just earned certification via the @ONE Introduction to Asynchronous Online Teaching & Learning certificate.</p> <p>Mike and Sandra were funded as reviewers through summer and all SPOT submissions have had at least an initial review. Sandra and Mike will be transitioning unfinished reviews back to Catherine. Much thanks to Mike and Sandra for their support during the COVID-created SPOT crisis.</p> <p>There have not been a lot of SPEQ sign-ups, and no one has yet earned the SPOT Equivalency, but several faculty are working on their SPEQ courses and plan to submit soon.</p>
SPOT Recertification	<p>I am happy to report that all of the 2022 cohort are recertified. The 2023 cohort is 36 faculty.</p>
Distance Learning Handbook	<p>I spent the summer creating a resource for faculty which can be integrated into the Distance Learning webpages.</p> <p>The DLC will be reviewing the material in this handbook over the semester.</p>
POCR Team	<p>Since the SEAP grant continued until the end of June 2022, the POCR Team was able to certify six more faculty courses as Quality Reviewed after the last DLC meeting, bringing the total to 18 courses. Mt. SAC now has a total of 30 Quality Reviewed courses that are aligned to the CVC Course Design Rubric.</p> <p>The POCR team is seeking continued funding.</p>
