C&I reviewed the DLC Recommendations for Recertification and approved them with the following changes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remove the bullet point with “Other courses offered for online faculty that were not created or presented by @ONE would need to be evaluated on a case-by-case basis” for simplicity and to mirror our current SPOT process, which only uses in-house and @ONE training for certification. • Revise the term “acceptable” in the final bullet point to reflect that FCLT or @ONE courses be counted toward recertification. <p>IIIA14</p>

CVC-OEI	<p>The Dean of Library and Learning Resources and DL Coordinators have reached out to interested CTE programs to see if they would like to participate in the Online CTE Pathways Grant. So far six groups have been interviewed – three in BUS, one in ARTS and one in Tech and Health. One grant focuses on supporting CTE faculty creating online courses, degrees, and certificates, marketing them to new constituencies, making them more accessible, building in affordable textbooks, and getting courses aligned with OEI rubric. The other grant focuses on the student experience and draws upon counselor experience and interaction. Meghan is writing the grant applications, which are due May 1. Both grants are one-year innovation grants.</p> <p>IIA, IIIC</p>
Vericite Update	<p>FCLT has identified a successor to Vericite. Unicheck has similarities to Vericite, integrates well into Canvas, costs less than Vericite (\$2/student with unlimited submissions), offers 24/5 support and seemed friendly and supportive. This choice will be taken to the BOT for approval in May. First year will be from June 1 2019-May 31 2020.</p> <p>IIIC</p>
REC Task Force Update	<p>The next meeting date for the REC Task Force is April 24. The committee is testing the first draft of the rubric and will start revision of AP 4105.</p> <p>IB9, IIA</p>
Online Equity Rubric	<p>An equity rubric used for online classes, drafted by the Peralta Community College District, was introduced and discussed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The DLC is an appropriate purview for initial discussion of an online rubric since promoting best practices online is a part of our purpose and function. • There is evidence of different success in online courses based on ethnicity and age, so this topic merits attention. • While this rubric gives some ideas about best practices, faculty noted that some disciplines might be better suited to demonstrate alignment than others, and that faculty development might be needed to successfully integrate different precepts. The DLC is not prepared to guide faculty on sensitive issues around equity and would like guidance from committees and individuals who have expertise in this area.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The DLC recommended that the Campus Equity and Diversity Committee or the Student Equity Committee be contacted and a dialogue begin about the concept of an equity rubric. It is noted that this is a conversation starter and that the DLC has not come to a decision about development or use of an online equity rubric. <p><i>Carol will reach out to the appropriate Committee to start a dialogue.</i></p> <p>IIA</p>
