Elementary



TEACHING CREDENTIALS







Multiple Subject Credential:

This credential authorizes a person to teach in a classroom where many different subjects are taught by a single individual, such as in elementary schools.

Single Subject Credential:

This credential authorizes a person to teach in a classroom where only one subject is taught, such as a classroom in departmentalized high schools and middle schools.

Education Specialist Instruction Credential:

This credential authorizes a person to teach and provide services to students who have a wide range of learning, emotional, and physical disabilities.

<u>Teacher Preparation Institute</u>: provides special support and services to students by helping them choose classes and make transfer decisions, so they may successfully transfer to a four-year institution to complete a teaching credential in elementary, secondary, or special education teaching.

<u>Child Development:</u> The Child Development and Education Department offers an excellent foundation in the core competencies essential to a career working directly or indirectly with infants, children, and families. Students engage in observation, practicum, and fieldwork experiences at the Mt. SAC Child Development Center where they learn developmental, linguistic, and culturally appropriate practices related to the care and education of young children. Education courses are also provided for students pursuing a career in K-12 education.

<u>Counseling Services</u>: Provides a range of services that include career, academic, and personal counseling, educational planning, and transfer preparation information. Check out recommend <u>course-to-course sequence maps</u> for degrees, certificates, and transfer to CSU Pomona

Mt. SAC Library: Provides a range of resources to prepare students pursuing careers in education, and support students in all areas of study. The library has exam preparation materials (e.g., CBEST exam prep books), career exploration resources, film and article databases in education, and more!

<u>Transfer Center:</u> Helps students prepare to transfer through workshops, activities, events, and advising.

<u>Financial Aid:</u> Helps students who might not otherwise be able to attend college. Although the primary responsibility for meeting college costs rests with the student and his/her family, it is recognized that many families have limited resources and are unable to meet the cost of a college education. Financial Aid provides assistance for students with documented financial needs.
