96.7% Agreed or Strongly Agreed

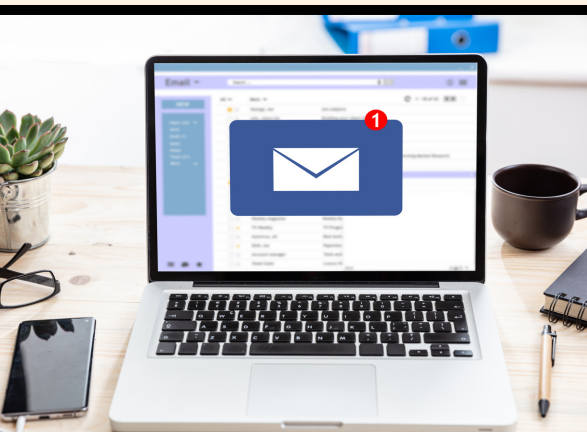
The 4-day event was the right length of time to participate in the auction
