**Metrics from California Community College Chancellor's Office
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May 8, 2019**

BACKGROUND

The California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) is working to reduce and simplify the multiple metrics required across their programs. The directive of the Metrics Simplification Working Group was a review of 109 metrics. In addition, the CCCCCO imposed a moratorium on yearly updates of many college metrics including Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative. The CCCCCO is going to provide guidance to the Colleges as to their legal requirements to review, use, and report on specific metrics already in circulation such as the Scorecard. The Board approved the most recent 2018 Scorecard on May 9, 2018.

An overview of the many metrics is below.

OVERVIEW

There are many metrics from the CCCCCO which the College is required to use to evaluate its progress in supporting student success. They are noted below and more detail can be found in the attached:

Other metrics used to evaluate students' success overlap with the above including the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges' Institution-set Standards. Based on the metrics noted above, the Institutional Effectiveness Committee will re-align the Institution-set Standards for 2019-2020.

While the CCCC created these metrics with some input from the colleges, there are issues with the validity of the data being provided to all colleges and there are procedural and technical issues with the technology, NOVA, being used to report and certify the information. The College continues to be vigilant with its understanding of and use of the data provided in conjunction with its many years of knowledge of the data. The College also continues to advocate for the CCCC to have the resources, time, and space needed to provide accurate and timely data and the processes.

PROJECTED IMPACT ON MT. SAC

It is essential for the College to review the findings on an ongoing basis to determine the programs and services that advance students' outcomes and what new ones could be offered.
